

THREDBO ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES

The Kosciuszko Thredbo Pty Ltd Environmental Services department are responsible for water supply, waste removal, recycling, sewage, car parking, courtesy buses and snow clearing within Thredbo. The Environmental Services Department can be contacted during office hours on **02 6459 4100**.

Recycling & Waste Disposal

Waste Collection

Kosciuszko Thredbo is responsible for the collection of waste from the enclosures located outside each property. The pick up days work on a roster system, with each property being serviced between 3 and 7 times per week depending upon the size and use of the premises. Generally, all apartments and smaller club lodges are cleared three times a week and larger premises with commercial kitchens five to seven days a week. The collection <u>schedule</u> for each lodge is <u>available on our</u> website or by contacting the department.

All <u>waste</u> is to be placed inside the enclosures to minimise the risk of native and feral animals getting into the rubbish and spreading disease. Waste should be placed inside plastic bags and tied up, with a total weight of less than <u>10kg per bag</u>. Loose waste in the enclosures will not be collected. All <u>cardboard</u> should be flattened and tied in manageable sized bundles or <u>stacked</u> in another box. It is the responsibility of the owner or manager to ensure that their enclosure is well managed and in a clean condition at all times. If a guest is unsure of the location of their waste enclosure, they should contact their booking agent or accommodation manager.

Recycling

Thredbo operates a kerbside <u>recycling</u> system. <u>Yellow polyweave bags</u> are provided for the collection of aluminium cans, glass bottles and jars, plastic bottles (all types) and steel cans. <u>Blue polyweave bags</u> are provided for the collection of paper and cardboard. Please do not contaminate recycling by disposing of crockery, drinking glasses, light globes, pyrex, broken glass, window glass, coffee cups, waxed cardboard, polystyrene, plastic bags or general waste in these recycling bags.

It is important to ensure that all recyclables are empty and clean before placing them in the bags. Full bags should be placed inside your waste enclosure and they will be collected by the Environmental Services crew, generally the day after the waste is collected. Please do not leave full recycle bags outside enclosures. The material is transported to a commercial recycler and processed to market.

Replacement recycle bags are provided at the same rate as the full ones are taken away. Additional bags are available for collection from the Valley Terminal reception or can be delivered to individual enclosures by giving the Environmental Services Department at least 24 hours notice.

Waste cooking oil is to be disposed of in the tins it is supplied in, that are to be

sealed and left in the waste enclosure. These will be collected on a regular basis. The oil is recycled into biofuel; so do not dispose of any foreign objects in the oil.

Other waste

Residents and guests of Thredbo should be aware that the disposal of 'hard waste' (eg, broken beds, mattresses, old heaters, old skis etc) is the responsibility of the individual owner of the property. All hard waste should be removed from the Kosciuszko National Park by the owner (or their contractor) and disposed of at the Jindabyne landfill, where commercial disposal rates are applicable.

Water Supply & Sewage

Kosciuszko Thredbo is responsible for the supply of treated potable water (drinking water) to the boundary of individual properties and the draining of sewage away from the boundaries within Thredbo. Any problems within individual buildings and property boundaries are the responsibility of the sub-lessees of the property, not Kosciuszko Thredbo, and queries should be directed in the first instance to the owner or manager of the property. Any issues associated with the village water reticulation system or the sewer main system should be directed to the Environmental Services Manager. Thredbo's drinking water is ultraviolet light disinfected and is tested on a regular basis to ensure compliance with the Australian Drinking Water Guidelines.

In accordance with the NSW Environment Protection Authority licence for the Thredbo sewerage infrastructure, Kosciuszko Thredbo Pty Ltd advises that the public telephone number that can be used to make a complaint related to the sewerage infrastructure or to report any sewage overflows from the Thredbo system is 02 6459 4100. Please be prepared to state the location of the overflow.

Courtesy Bus Service (Winter Only)

Route One

From the Information Centre South bus stop, a designated "Crackenback Ridge, Bobuck Lane & Friday Flat" bus proceeds along Friday Drive from the Information Centre South, turns right into Crackenback Drive and services the bus stops in Crackenback Ridge located at the points noted below. The bus then returns down Crackenback Drive and turns right into Diggings Terrace. The bus then proceeds around the village, directly along Bobuck Lane and back to the Information Centre North set down only bus stop, located opposite the Information Centre (to drop off any passengers for Valley Terminal base station or the Village Centre – all Friday Flat bound passengers stay on board). The bus then continues along Friday Drive to the Friday Flat North (set down only) stop, turns around the roundabout, collects guests from the Friday Flat South "Village Loop Services Only" bus stops and returns to the Information Centre South. The stops that are serviced by **Route One** are in the following order:

- 1. Information Centre South
- 2. Community Centre
- 3. Ski In Ski Out (at the roundabout at the end of Crackenback Drive)
- 4. Crackenback Ridge (at the intersection of Ramshead Lane),
- 5. Crackenback Ridge (at the intersection of Cascades Close),
- 6. Bela's Corner (at Candlelight),

- 7. The Peak (on Bobuck lane),
- 8. Stein's Corner (at the top near Leatherbarrel Lodge, on Bobuck Lane).
- 9. Information Centre North (set down only),
- 10. Woodridge (set down only for guests going to the Leisure Centre)
- 11. Friday Flat North (set down only),
- 12. Friday Flat South
- 13. Information Centre South

Route Two

From the Information Centre South bus stop, a designated "Banjo Drive, Digging's Terrace & Friday Flat" bus proceeds along Friday Drive from the Information Centre, around Diggings Terrace, up Banjo Drive to the Alpine Way where it turns around and returns to the Information Centre North set down only bus stop along the same route. The bus then proceeds to Friday Flat North set down only, turns around the roundabout, collects guests from the Friday Flat South "Village Loop Services Only" bus stops and returns to the Information Centre South. The stops that are serviced by **Route Two** are in the following order:

- 1. Information Centre South,
- 2. Riverside (set down only), at intersection of Thyne Reid Dve and Friday Dve
- 3. Steamboat (on Diggings Terrace, adjacent to Steamboat),
- 4. Bela's Corner (at Candlelight),
- 5. Lantern Apartments (on Banjo Drive),
- 6. Steamboat (set down only) (on Diggings Terrace, adjacent to Steamboat),
- 8. Riverside Cabins,
- 9. Information Centre North (set down only),
- 10. Woodridge (set down only for guests going to the Leisure Centre)
- 11. Friday Flat North (set down only).
- 12. Friday Flat South (pick up only),
- 13. Information Centre South

Route Three

Information Centre to Friday Flat. From the Information Centre bus stop the bus proceeds along Friday Drive to Friday Flat base station area. The large red and black buses service this route. The bus stops serviced by **Route Three** are in the following order:

- 1. Information Centre.
- 2. Woodridge / Thredbo Leisure Centre,
- 3. Friday Flat North (set down only) and South (pick up only),
- 4. Thredbo Leisure Centre / Woodridge,
- 5. Service Station (for passengers going to Friday Flat as well),
- 6. Information Centre

Visitors should be aware of the bus they get on, to avoid confusion, it is recommended that passengers check the signage on the buses or ask the driver before getting on.

All Thredbo buses are equipped with external ski racks for the convenience of guests. Just a couple of tips; Please take all snowboards, children's skis (i.e. less

than 130cm in length), twin tip skis and ski poles on board the bus as the racks do not cater for these.

Car Parking

Overnight car parking

In Thredbo, public overnight car parking is located on the southern side of Friday Drive, adjacent to the Thredbo Leisure Centre and also at Friday Flat. There are a total of four overnight car parks all signposted as "P Overnight". Guests should make their way to the nearest bus stop located on Friday Drive for transport into the village.

Day car parking

<u>Day car parking</u> is located at <u>Friday Flat</u>. A variety of 15 minute "drop off" zones exist at both Friday Flat and adjacent to the Information Centre bus stop. Guests are reminded that Day parking is between the hours of <u>7:00am and 7:00pm</u> to allow snow clearing operations to be carried out overnight.

On site car parking

In addition to the public overnight car parking, most accommodation in Thredbo has on site parking. Please check availability when booking. Vehicles should be parked in designated car spaces only and should not stick out onto adjacent roadways, as there is the potential to interfere with snow clearing and courtesy bus operations.

Parking Infringements

The National Parks and Wildlife Service Vehicle Compliance Officers are responsible for the enforcement of parking regulations within Thredbo in both summer and winter. The NSW Roads and Maritime Services are responsible for the management of the Alpine Way. Any vehicle found parked illegally in a designated parking zone may be liable for a fine, processed by the NSW Police Force. This means that non-payment of fines may result in further prosecution and resulting loss of licence de-merit points for the vehicles owner. The current fine is applicable to a whole range of parking fines, including vehicles that are illegally parked in designated car parks belonging to others, or for not having the appropriate park use fee displayed.

Snow Clearing

Snow clearing operations in Thredbo are conducted by Kosciuszko Thredbo, who are responsible for the clearing of all public roads, car parks and most formalised walking paths. Snow clearing of private driveways and car parks remains the responsibility of the individual sub lessee. Kosciuszko Thredbo does not clear private driveways or car parks due to liability issues. Several private snow-clearing contractors operate in Thredbo over winter; details can be obtained by contacting the Environmental Services Manager during office hours on **02 6459 4100**.
